Which graduate program is right for you?

Master of Arts

30 credits in about 2 to 5 years

The M.A. is our “flagship” program, established in 2012. Take 8 excellent FLT courses and complete an experiential module capstone project customized for your language, experience, and goals. Display your work on your portfolio website. Emphasizes proficiency and teacher leadership.

Graduate Certificate

10 credits in 2 to 4 semesters

Designed primarily for teachers who already have graduate degrees. Choose 3 courses from the FLT curriculum that appeal to you and complete a portfolio. Expand your pedagogical and program administration skills. Credits can count toward the M.A.
